PINNING TRADITION

The School of Nursing pin is a distinctive mark, rich in history and meaning. It can be traced to heraldry, which is the system of devising and granting insignias for Coats of Arms. The Pinning Ceremony is a time-honored nursing school tradition, dating back to 1855 when Florence Nightingale was awarded a broach by England's Queen Victoria for her efforts in the Crimean War. It signifies the integrity and tradition of badges worn by the early healers and crusaders of care. Over the course of time, the Pinning Ceremony has evolved and for most, marks the passage from that of student nurse role to the practice role, and for some, the attainment of advanced education.

Each school adopts its own symbol to indicate the excellent nursing education the student received. In the Pinning Ceremony performed today, each baccalaureate student may receive a pin that proudly displays Northeastern University's motto Lux Veritas Virtus. Regardless of where their new careers in nursing take them, their pins will let their colleagues and patients know where they earned their nursing credentials. The pin also signifies the acceptance of the many responsibilities incumbent upon those entering into the profession and practice of nursing. Wearing of the nursing pin is a source of pride.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Valeria Ramdin PhD, MS, APRN-BC, CNE, FPCC



Dr. Valeria Ramdin is an esteemed professional, with exemplary expertise, steadfast leadership, and unwavering commitment to excellence. She is a nursing educator, scientist, entrepreneur, author, co-editor, consultant and Board Director for both education and practice corporations. She currently serves as the Director of Global Health Affairs and Clinical Professor in the Bouvé College

of Health Sciences School of Nursing. Dr. Ramdin also previously served as the Assistant Dean for the School of Nursing's Undergraduate programs.

She is a board-certified nurse practitioner, whose extensive years of service include frontline work during the Covid-19 pandemic with the Massachusetts Reserve Corp and annual clinical mission trips to the Caribbean. She is also the founder of an innovative Family Health Pod Care Model. Her research focuses on healthy aging, and cancer outcomes.

Dr. Ramdin is frequently invited to speak locally, regionally, and internationally. Among her most distinguished were on Strategies to Successfully Navigate Mentee and Mentoring Relationships at the African Caribbean Cancer Consortium [AC3] conference held in Kenya; and her keynote address as the inaugural Global Scholar on "Nurses as Global Citizens" at The University of Alabama.

She is a Subject Matter Expert Reviewer and Content Developer in the field of nursing and healthcare for publishers. Throughout her distinguished career, she has been honored with numerous awards including, The Excellence in Leadership Award from The New England Regional Black Nurses Association; a Fellowship for Person Centered Care (FPCC) Planetree International Inc.; a BioMedical Research Award from Novartis and the Harvard Medical School; the 2014 Distinguish Services Award during her tenure as Assistant Dean; the Bernay's Doris Fleischman Award for Excellence in Nursing from Mount Auburn Hospital, Cambridge and the Excellence in Teaching Award from the Massachusetts Association of Colleges of Nursing.

Dr. Ramdin earned a nursing diploma from the Tercentary School of Nursing in Barbados; a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree with high honors, a Master of Science degree with specialization as a primary care nurse practitioner, and a Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing from Northeastern University; a certificate in diversity and equity from Cornell University; and a Certificate in Women's Leadership Development from Oxford University. She also completed significant education in the field of law, policy, and society.

Dr. Ramdin's extensive years of nursing experience which spans a regional, national, and global presence has positioned her to be inducted as a Fellow into the American Academy of Nursing in October 2025.
